Overview of Title I Services

Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, provides financial assistance to local educational agencies and schools with high numbers or high percentages of children from low-income families to help ensure that all children meet challenging state academic standards. Federal funds are currently allocated through four statutory formulas that are based primarily on census poverty estimates and the cost of education in each state.

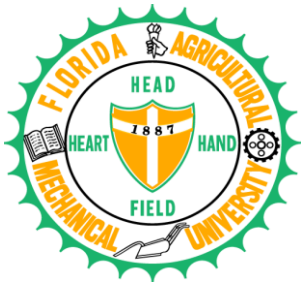
The Title I Schoolwide Program at FAMU DRS, will put into operation programs, activities, resources, and procedures for the following:

- providing high-quality professional development for the faculty and staff;
- purchase of materials aligned to State academic standards;
- meeting the educational needs of low-achieving children in our Nation's highest-poverty schools, limited English proficient children, migratory children, children with disabilities, Indian children, neglected or delinquent children, and young children in need of reading assistance;
- closing the achievement gap between high- and low-performing children;
- involvement of parents/guardians in substantial and meaningful opportunities to participate in the education of their children;
- coordinate the efforts to assure successful implementations of the approved programs.
